Classification of successful candidates shall be as follows:

First Division 60% of the aggregate marks obtained at the Part I, Part II & Part III Examination, taken together.

All the rest will be declared to have passed the Examination if they obtain the minimum pass marks in each subject, viz. 36%. No division shall be awarded at the Part-I and Part-II examination.
