

Globalization can be defined as the growing interconnection of political, economic, cultural and social systems among nations. This is facilitated by cross country flows of information, ideas, technologies, goods, services, capital, finance and people. Cross border integration can have several dimensions — cultural, social, political and economic. In fact, sometimes cultural and social integration is feared even more than economic integration. Empirically globalization has broken down cultural boundaries through wide availability of air travel, greater accessibility of telecommunications and promotion of mass tourism.

The term global culture now implies both development of a cultural cosmopolitanism spanning the globe and redeployment of cultural consciousness for accentuating specific identities at local level. The global culture is nourished by media and market forces. The fear of "cultural hegemony" has spurred a lot of debate amongst scholars working in the field of cultural studies.
