

**Paper-I (Code-D-1007) Constitution, Constitutionalism and Rule of Law :
Principles and Applications-II**

Max. Marks – 70

Attempt any five assignments in 400-500 words each. Each question carries 14 marks.

1. Demonstrate the Centralizing character of Indian Federalism by examining in detail the identity of states, the legislative competency and Regional Emergency.
2. Provide an overview of basic federal framework by (i) examining the existence of two levels of Government (ii) distribution of power between two levels of Government (iii) Supremacy of Constitution and (iv) Dispute resolution mechanism two levels of Government.
3. Distinguish between the two concepts of "Competence and Repugnancy" and examine through cases the law on the two concepts.
4. How is Part XIII comprising of Articles 301 to 305 fundamental to the federal structure of the Constitution ? Please keep the main focus on "Compensatory taxes" related cases Law.
5. Discuss the issues for resolution of inter-state river water disputes within Constitutional Framework, Inter-state Water Dispute Act, 1956 and bar of Supreme Court jurisdiction on river disputes.
6. Discuss the fiscal aspects of federalism covering matter of expenditure and revenue at different levels of Government providing an analysis with original structure of fiscal federalism and most recent Constitutional Amendments.
7. Provide the legal architecture of Asymmetric Federal provisions included in the Constitution with regard to autonomy arrangement in North Eastern region of India, the special status of J&K; the administration of tribal areas in 5th and 6th Schedule and provision related to Intra-state inequality in States of Andhra Pradesh, Gurjarat, Maharastra and Karnataka.
8. Examine functions and power of local bodies and the place in the federal framework as listed in Schedule XI and XIII and related Articles in the Constitution.
9. Provide and outline of Constitutional and Statutory provision of local government in India by looking at the structure of local government bodies, composition of local bodies and conduct of their elections.
10. National Unity and integrity and Machinery of Federal Relation : Discuss phases of Federalism after independence, Governor's role and Constitutional emergencies.


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Paper-II (Code-D-1008) Administrative Process and Judicial Control

Attempt any five assignments in 400-500 words each. Each question carries 14 marks.

1. Examine and explain the following statements :
 - a) Public Interest Litigation is a tool to promote politics of the judiciary.
 - b) Judicial Activism has both positive and negative impact on the judiciary.
2. What are the constitutional safeguards available in a civil servant against dismissal, removal or reduction in rank of services ? Are these rights also available to an employees of a public corporation. Discuss with reference to statutory provisions and case laws.
3. Under what circumstances, does a third party, apart from concerned parties, have locus standi to move writ petitions before the High Court or the or the Supreme Court in India ? Also point out the limitations of such petitions.
4. Examine the nature of the powers of the High Court under Article 226 of the Constitution of India and distinguish it from the power of Supreme Court under Article 32.
5. Discuss the Constitutionality of delegated legislation. What are the limits of delegated legislation ? Explain.
6. Explain the significance of the rule of "audi alterm partem" in administrative decision making and state the circumstances under which "post decisional hearing" can effectively satisfy the mandate of nature justice.
7. What do you understand by the term "eminent domain" ? Discuss it's relevance in the present day context.
8. Discuss in detail the grounds on which administrative actions can be subjected to judicial review.
9. Do you agree with the statement that "All Human Rights are Fundamental Rights Protected and recognized by the Constitution of India". Discuss with reference to statutory provisions and case laws.
10. Write critical notes on the following :
 - a) Doctrine of Ultra Vires.
 - b) Doctrine of Police Power.
