On the auspicious occasion of Lord Mahaveer's 2500th Nirvan Mahotsava the Centre for Jain Studies was establishedin1975andaChair founded for promoting research work in Jainism. The Centre has a missionary zealot sponsor and promotes research in Jain Studies and other aspects of Comparative Religions and Culture.

At the time of establishment of the Centre the University had taken a decision that Jainology be treated more as an area of research and the main purpose for establishing the chair should be to encourage the study of Jain religion and ethics in the related departments i.e. Sanskrit, Hindi, Philosophy, Psychology, Sociology, Political Science, Public Administration and History, already existing in the University, and conduct and direct research in the field of Jainology.

It is one of the premier institutions of international repute for Jain Studies in India, engaged in research on various aspects of Jain Studies and Manuscriptology, committed for dissemination of knowledge on Prakrit, Apabharmsa language & Literature, Jain Philosophy & religion and Manuscriptology in a comparative, critical and historical perspective.

Strengths:

- o Perhaps this is the only center in this state which is imparting education in Jain studies
- o Perhaps this is the only center in this state where research in Jain studies is going on.
- o Center is involved in publishing articles related with Jain studies.
- o Center is regularly organizing seminars and workshops
- o Center is regularly cataloguing of manuscripts on Jain studies.
- o Center is regularly organizing extension lectures

Weakness:

- o Center is feeling shortage of teaching staff
- o Shortage of non-teaching staff is making different activities of this center difficult.
- o Center is not having sufficient space.
- o Center requires good funding to establish this center as center for excellence.

Opportunities:

o Center provides a vast scope to its students in field of research.

52. Future plans of the department.

Following are the plans related with this center:

- o Building up of a manuscript library for preservation of ancient and medieval Jaina literature, systematically cataloguing them, and making them available to the scholarly world for consultation and research work.
- o Correspondingly setting up a strong research reference library of published works/books and periodicals.
- o Editing and publishing Jaina literary works, beginning from the canonical to narrative literature, as also books dealing with Jaina art and architecture.
- o Publishing the Institute's own Research Journal.
- Organizing continually inter-disciplinary seminars and conferences with a view to evaluating comparative contribution of Jainism to Indology including religion, philosophy and culture and also development of languages.
- Publication of important manuscripts in Prakrit, Apabhrmsa and Sanskrit bearing upon different facets of Jainism.
- Continues to organize extension lectures by eminent scholars of Jainism and their publication and also to arrange lectures, Seminars, etc., with a view to popularise literature of Prakrit and Sanskrit languages.
- o Helping researchers of other Departments/Institutions so far as they relate to Jainism.
- o Formulating and completing short term and long term projects relating to specific problems of language, literature, History and culture of Jainism.
- o To help in the propagation of Prakrit, Sanskrit and Apabhrmsa languages and literature, at global level.
- To help make the studies of Prakrit, Sanskrit and Apabhrmsa languages bright and continuing.
- o To prepare descriptive catalogues of MSS lying in the various Jain GranthBhandars in the Rajasthan state.

- Rajasthan has been a flourishing field for Jainism through the ages in the area of religion, literature, architecture, sculpture, and painting. It is a treasure house of Manuscripts of Jaina and Non-Jaina literature preserved by Jain scholars and sadhus in the form of very rich Libraries, Granthagaras and Upashrayas. The rich and religious Jain community and dedicated Jain monks look forward towards the Centre for Jain Studies on the campus as an institution which can contribute a lot to the comparative study of different sects and religions in the disciplines of art and architecture, literature, philosophy, history and archaeology in the context of Jainism and Jainology. As such, the development of this centre shall not only serve the purpose of the centre in true sense but shall bring repute and honour to the University of Rajasthan as also the state of Rajasthan, during coming years.
- The centre has an ambitious plan for construction of a huge building in the university campus for accommodating the following five units under the auspices of the Centre for Jain Studies. This has also the blessing and approval of the Vice-chancellor and other authorities of the University:-
 - Jain Archaeology Unit.
 - > Jain Manuscriptology Unit.
 - Unit of Prakrit& Jain Darshan.
 - Unit of Non-violence & Peace.
- O Shri Bharatvarshiya Digamber Jain (Teerth Sanrakshini) Mahasabha, Rajasthan Chapter has also agreed to contribute a sum of Rs. 2 crore for establishing Vardhaman Shraman Faculty in the above building under the Centre for Jain Studies within the above five units. The university has agreed to provide sufficient space and to arrange matching grant for the building and also for meeting recurring expenditure on staff etc. in due course of time. This project is yet to be materialized.
