The Centre, since its opening in 2008, has continuously strived for deliberating on issues of discrimination, exclusion of vulnerable groups. It has organized seminars discussions, symposia and conference on various dimensions of exclusion and marginalization. Ministry of Rural Development had also sponsored a National conference along with UGC in 2011. A status report on Higher education in Rajasthan has been published by the Centre.

51. Detail five major Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Challenges (SWOC)of the department.

Following are major Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities and Challenges of the department:

Strengths:

- This Centre was opened by UGC in 2008 to work in the area of social exclusion and affirmative action towards inclusive policy. The mandate of the UGC was to encourage inter-disciplinary research in order to suggest ways for ensuring inclusive growth and development. The UGC also gave 08 Faculty positions along with 02 research assistants and 05 supporting staff.
- Focused research based programme
- Research area of great significance
- Encourages interdisciplinary research on dynamics of social exclusion and contributes to academic debates in social science
- Building infrastructure is available to ensure proper working.

Weaknesses:

• The biggest weakness is the inability to make appointments on the positions granted by the UGC. The Centre made appointments of Non-teaching staff in 2010 and the same were discontinued in 2012 even though the Centre was continued for XII Plan also. At present apart from the Director, who is also Honorary, there is no faculty. It is very difficult to plan any activity without any staff (teaching and non-teaching)

Opportunities:

- The UGC created 33 such centers in the country which would focus on interdisciplinary research. The focus of XII Plan is on 'Faster Sustainable and more Inclusive Growth' which needs ground level research in issues concerning marginalized groups and areas which can be catered by the Centre by taking up research projects.
- Center can be developed as a resource center with data base for advancement of knowledge on areas of social exclusion, marginalization
- Center can establish linkages with civil society organizations and work in the field
- Center can develop short term orientation programmes for public representatives, government officials, journalists, NGO personnel
- Center can develop Training and research modules helpful in policy making

Challenges

• Appointments on UGC sanctioned positions of both teaching and non-teaching.

- Release of funds by UGC
- Continuity of the center after XII plan.

The Centre has been granted extension by the UGC in XII Plan also (Till 2017).It proposes to work with a multi-pronged approach for strengthening the center. It plans to engage teaching programmes as well as research. Following are the plans of the center:

- Center plans to develop modules on issues of social exclusion to the students at Undergraduate and post graduate level
- Center plans to develop training modules for Government officials at all levels
- Center is developing M.Phil. Course in Social exclusion studies

• Center is documenting and preparing a data base on the issues of marginalization and exclusion

Academic activities:

- Center is planning to organize conferences, seminars, symposia and public lectures on the themes of Social Exclusion
- It is also planning to publish regularly its research findings.

Extension and Networking:

 Centre is planning to collaborate with Civil Society organizations to increase public understanding of how disadvantage/marginalization is structured and to respond to the community-identified needs which are imperative for policy solution.
