The Department is running different specialized courses such as Philosophy of History, Historiography, History of Science and Technology, History of Buddhism, Major Revolutions, History of Rajasthan etc. Eminent scholars of the department have contributed in the knowledge of History including Prof. Mathura Lal Sharma, Prof. G.N. Sharma in the History and sources of Rajasthan; Prof. G.C. Pande, well know historian, Philosophers and Sanskritist contributed in the Study of Buddhist Philosophy, Philosophy of History, Vedic Studies, Sanskrit Literature etc; Prof. M.S. Jain and Prof. Devendra Kaushika in the field of Modern political and economic history; Prof. R. Nath's contribution in the study of Indus Script is noteworthy. The Department is equipped with the Reghuvanshi Memorial Library (Approx. 5500 books), a Museum with various artifacts and the required paraphernalia for archaeological Studies, along with TV-VCR, Maps and Computer.

The faculty and the research scholars of the Department have made seminal, original and substantive contribution towards creation of knowledge in the history, culture and society of Rajasthan by way of writing books and research papers and participation in seminars.

Strengths

- Good Number of Students (nearly 425) are studying for different programmes by the department.
- Department has well-equipped Raghuvanshi Library (with nearly 5500 Books)

- Archaeological equipment's and remains found from excavation may be seen in the department.
- Department regularly publishes annual research journal JIJNASA.

Weaknesses

- For efficient functioning and delivery, department needs to have the following:
- The Department urgently needs a Librarian since it has a vast collection of books in the following libraries housed in the department:
 - Raghuvanshi Library
 - Library of Buddhist Study Centre
 - Library of Centre of Museology and Conservation
 - Library of Shri Guru Gobind Singh Centre for Sikh Studies
- One post of Associate Professor (qualified Archaeologist with diploma or degree in Archaeology approved by ASE) is required.
- Department feels the need of audio visual and other innovative aids for teacher effectiveness, dynamic and state of the art teaching methodologies.
- Rationalizing, modernizing and restructuring of syllabi needs to be undertaken at regular intervals to keep up with recent trends and knowledge in history writing and to meet the new challenges and the needs of the students.

Challenges

- For a long time the Department had been seriously impacted by paucity of teaching staff. This had resulted in closure of many important papers. With the appointment of new teachers the department has to revive and revitalize these papers.
- In the absence of librarian rare and out of print books along with other useful publications are lying unused and unattended.
- With the appointment of new teachers and resumption of papers the department is suffering from infrastructural weaknesses like shortage of classrooms and basic amenities like toilets and drinking water.
- Urgent revitalization of the syllabi to attract students.
- The teaching methods need urgent improvement as traditional lecture methodology is leading to student apathy. Innovative pedagogical methods and teaching aids need to be introduced.

Opportunities

- To have a Special Assistance Programme on "Indian Historiography & History Writing".
- To establish the Advanced Centre for Studies on the Sources of Indian History.
- PG Diploma in Historical Heritage and Tourism in Rajasthan.
- To develop the Department as a resource centre for research in Rajasthan studies for scholars from all over India.

52. Future plans of the department.

The appointment of seventeen new Assistant Professors in the Department has not only resolved the critical problem of paucity of teaching faculty in the Department but has built hopes for enrichment of research, teaching and other co-curricular activities. In view of this; the Department aims at undertaking the following activities in coming time:

- To have a special assistance programme on "Indian Historiography and History writing" with also special reference to Rajasthan History.
- To establish the Advanced Study Centre for study of the' Sources of Indian History'. Availability of new sources and different interpretation presents a opportunity to study sources in new light. This study shall contribute to solve many debates in History writing.
- To start the course of P.G. Diploma in " Historical Heritage and Tourism in Rajasthan" As we are all aware that Rajasthan is rich in heritage and have a wide scope of tourism, in this regard this type of course open new avenues for various types of tourism in Rajasthan and gave opportunities to student to take an employment in tourism and Heritage study.
- To create e-database in library
- To cataloguing of the library books and to make e-database in Raghuvanshi Library of the Department.
- To create ICT, smart class rooms and e-learning sources (e-books, e-journals, etc.) for the technical and academic enhancement of the students and teachers both. It is a necessary part of the any advanced study centre and UGC is also promoting these facilities to the institution for the advancements in technical knowledge in teaching.
- To organize workshop for the creation of teaching modules which shall contributes to make teaching interesting for the teachers and students both.
- Educational Institution is also responsible for overall development of the students, In this light department is also proposed Yoga Classes, Meditation Sessions in the auspices of Buddhist Study Centre.
